### FEDERAL DISASTER DECLARATION FACT SHEET

**APRIL 30, 2014**

On April 30, 2014, President Obama issued a major disaster declaration for the State of Mississippi triggering the release of Federal funds to help people and communities recover from the Severe Storms, Tornadoes, and Flooding that began April 28, 2014, and continuing. Details of the disaster declaration and assistance programs are as follows:

Declaration Number: FEMA-4175-DR

Incident: Severe Storms, Tornadoes, and Flooding

Incident Period: April 28, 2014, and continuing

Federal Coordinating Officer: Mark H. Landry

Individual Assistance (IA): (Assistance to individuals and households):

IA-Designated Counties: Itawamba, Lee, Lowndes, Madison, Rankin, Wayne, and Winston Counties.

Public Assistance (PA): (Assistance for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities):

PA-Designated Counties: Itawamba, Lee, Lowndes, Madison, Rankin, Wayne, and Winston Counties for debris removal and emergency protective measures (Categories A and B), including direct federal assistance, under the Public Assistance program.

Hazard Mitigation (HM): (Assistance for actions taken to prevent or reduce long-term risk to life and property from natural hazards):

HM-Designated Counties: All counties in the State of Mississippi are eligible to apply for assistance under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.

OTHER: Additional designations may be made at a later date if requested by the State and warranted by the results of further damage assessments.
